

#### **Monkey Class**

Monkey class have had a lovely second week into March. Earlier this week, we started our DT project, making a cat toy - to do this we weaved pipe cleaners together, making a really cool pattern. In our English lessons, this week, we have been looking at traditional tales and even making our own versions of them; a personal favourite of mine was the modern adaptation of Three Billy Goat's Gruff our class came up with. Wednesday's science lesson looked into air resistance - we made boats out of junk modelling resources and then had a race by blowing them across water. We made some awesome garments in life skills, where we looked at different cultural dressing styles and made our own version of culturally inspired clothing. Also, of course, we cannot forget the hard work being put into the Matilda song rehearsals - this has been our music topic, which is beginning to have us singing 'Revolting Children' on repeat. This tied in with our history, where we learnt about toys from the past and present and making predictions about what toys we may have in the future. We have been learning very difficult maths with mental methods for addition and subtraction with up to 3 digits, as well as two step equations which have really pushed our maths skills but I was amazed at how quickly we learnt this.
