As you can see from this week's photo, we value collaborative learning with Crocodile class, our parallel year group; extending our friendship group possibilities and because it has been done in slow, Selwyn stages it paved the way for a super experience for a couple of boys in last 'Friday fun time' being spent together discussing the merits and values of star wars Lego minifigures, using books as reference materials. We, at Selwyn ,take change slowly and supportively; there is very little to be gained by rushing through, and we as educators can spot the small increments of progress. I am so proud of the changes that I have seen in your children over the past months: requesting to read books to grown-ups when once books wouldn't even be picked up, colouring pictures using different colours when once everything was coloured in black, asking for help when you need it when once the only answer was to feel dysregulated, sitting next to other people at lunch when once being near people was too much, handing work in to me with the name and date at the top when once it was all screwed up into a ball





and destroyed. We are helping your children to make choices that are the best for them and their futures, rather than worry about what others are doing. This is what makes Selwyn Hall a truly bespoke educational experience because it is the individual that we build relationships with and can tailor their learning pathways for them.
